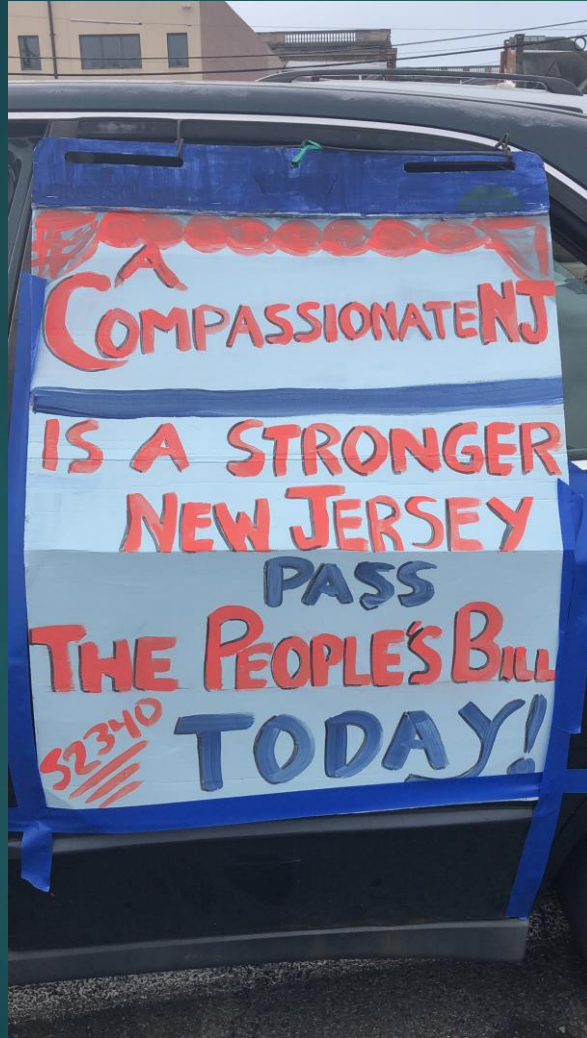

The People's Bill



“People’s Bill” (A-4034/S-2340) is based on several fundamental principles needed to provide strong housing protections throughout the crisis. No renter or homeowner should:

- Lose their home through eviction or foreclosure
- Have their credit damaged
- Lose their ability to find a home in the future because of the pandemic

The People's Bill

- Establishes firm guidelines to establish housing stability for Covid-impacted residents as well as create consumer protections for residents participating in any forbearance/repayment program. It also establishes clear repayment guidelines.
- A collaboration with the bill's sponsors, Assemblywoman Britnee Timberlake (D-Essex) and Sen. Troy Singleton (D-Burlington), and housing advocates.
- The bill passed the Assembly in July and has support from Governor Murphy but has stalled in the Senate.
